

MINUTES OF FIRST MEETING HELD ON 5 JUNE 2002 FOR DUNVILLE ROAD.

1. Erick Retzlaff welcomed all to the meeting.
2. 4 Apologies
3. Discussed the crime rate which has increased over the last year in Dunville Road.
4. No resources available.
5. Be aware and to help oneself and neighbours ie be vigilant about what happens around your area.

A. Possible election of leader/co-leader and secretary for the Neighbourhood Watch.

1. Decision to be made by the next meeting which will be on 19 June 2002.
2. The leader who is nominated must be able to attend the crime forum (SAP) as well as the meetings pertaining to the Neighbourhood Watch.
3. Co-leader to assist should the leader be unable to attend the meetings etc in the event of leave.
4. Recruit more neighbours to the meeting and then to make elections at a later stage.

B. Possibility of splitting up Dunville Road into two independent Neighbourhood Watches

1. Upper and lower Dunville Road to have their own Neighbourhood Watch as duties for one leader may be too much.
2. With two Neighbourhood Watches the road will be stronger ie tighter control and more security in the road.

C. Spokes people to attend our meetings.

1. Will discuss how their Neighbourhood Watches are progressing and success achieved with having Neighbourhood Watch in their roads.

D. Recruit more neighbours to attend the meetings.

1. Contact neighbours and encourage them to attend the next meeting.
2. Advise neighbours when you are going away so that they may keep an eye on your property.
3. Neighbours to remove post in post boxes when you are away for a long time as this is a clear indication that you are away.

Methods of house breakings to be aware of in future.

- A. Strange car in road just cruising up and down and observing the houses.
- B. Vendors calling from the road, trying to attract your attention.
- C. Donations etc.
- D. Selling of brooms.
- E. Dog's being sprayed with Spray and Cook.
- F. Plastic bags used over the dog's head.
- G. Stone's being left on the verge or strange objects.
